CCS Partnering with the College of Southeastern to offer Dual Enrollment



Over the past year, Crossroads has been working on a concurrent dual enrollment agreement with the College of Southeastern, a Christian liberal arts college located in Wake Forest. Their accreditation body has approved this agreement and the credentials of our school and staff have met the necessary accreditation standards for concurrent dual enrollment and college credit.

Beginning next school year, Crossroads will be offering classes on campus that can be taken concurrently for high school credit and College at Southeastern college credit. We are still in the process of finalizing which courses will be taught concurrently, but our goal is to offer dual enrollment courses in Bible, English, Science, and History over the coming years. More information will be made available over the coming months, including a list of courses that will be offered and how those courses will transfer to various colleges and universities. Crossroads is excited about this partnership with the College of Southeastern and the opportunities it will provide our students.

Crossroads Christian School was proud and honored to host the 2018 Southeast District ACSI Art Festival, an annual event held in districts across the US within the ACSI organization. This year we had approximately 150 students from five different schools participating. Competing in our district was Berean Baptist Academy from Fayetteville, Christ the Cornerstone from Laurinburg, NC, Crossroads Christian School of Henderson, Faith Christian School from Rocky Mount, Freedom Christian Academy from Fayetteville.

This year's event was held on Friday, March 16. Competing students in grades 3-12 participated in creative workshops led by Jody Bohannon of Clarksville, Va. and Maria DeHaseth of Youngsville. Some of the categories entered this year included acrylic paintings, drawings, photography, digital art, mixed media, and more. Each entry was reviewed by three different judges provided by three different schools. Each piece was evaluated on Design and Composition, Creativity, Technique, and Presentation.
