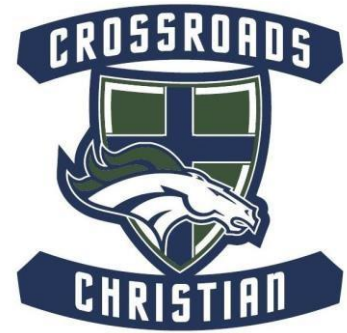


# CROSSROADS NEWS

The guidelines we have in place are for the maximum safety of our families and our staff. Please take a moment to read through these:

- Masks will be required for everyone attending (CCS will not provide masks).
- All individuals will have their temperatures checked as they enter the building.
  - *Preschool, Pre-K & Lower school grades (K-6<sup>th</sup>)*: Enter through the side door to the left of the main building.
  - *Upper school grades (7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>)*: Enter through the main gym entrance at the back of the school.
- 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades:
  - Computers will be available for pick-up for returning students in grades 7-12 (completed user agreement form required).
  - New upper school students will receive their tablets when school begins (completed user agreement form required).
  - Schedules will be available for pick-up in the upper school hallway.
- Families with students in both lower and upper school should enter at the gym entrance.
- Mrs. Pegram & Mrs. Williams will be available in the office for you to pay outstanding balances, receive a parking pass (for students who drive – must complete form), place funds on a lunch account, or ask a financial question.
- Lower school families interested in after-care will need to see Mrs. Jarrell in Room 122 (After-Care Room).

## COVID GUIDELINES AS WE BEGIN 2021-2022

---

- **Masks/Face Coverings:** Crossroads will begin the school year allowing each family to decide what is best for their student(s) regarding wearing a mask/face covering while on campus. Students must provide their own facemasks/face shields if they choose to wear them. If there are outbreaks of COVID in the CCS community, a decision regarding the parameters of a mask mandate will be made at that time.
- **Health & Wellness Commitment:** Crossroads will continue asking families to support our health and wellness commitment by keeping their student at home when they are not feeling well, experiencing COVID-like symptoms, have been potentially exposed to someone that has tested positive, or someone within their household is awaiting test results.
- **Campus Cleaning:** Crossroads will continue daily disinfecting and sanitizing throughout campus and in school-owned vehicles before/after trips. Classrooms will continue to be disinfected during lunch and after school daily.
- **Hand Sanitizing/Washing:** Crossroads will continue to provide hand sanitizing stations and encourage handwashing throughout the school day.
- **Social Distancing:** Crossroads will continue to encourage social distancing, whenever possible.
- **Classrooms:** Classroom desks will continue to be separated as much as physically possible and will face in the same direction. Classroom furniture will still be limited to only necessary, CCS-issued furniture.
- **Drinking Fountains and Water Bottles:** Students should plan to bring water bottles to school. Drinking fountains in the lower school, upper school, outside the gym, and outside of the library will be available only to fill bottles with water (bottle filling stations have been added). Students should not drink directly from water fountains and should only use them to refill water bottles.



## DRESS CODE 2021-2022

---



### Romans 12:1-2

*"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good, and acceptable and perfect will of God."*

Students must always be neatly and modestly dressed at school and all school events, both on and off campus. Parents are strongly urged to supervise their child's dress on a daily basis. Final determination rests in the hands of the administration.

### Dress for Preschool (K2, K3, K4)

Children should wear washable, serviceable clothes to school each day. Dress-up clothes should be saved for Sunday or for Chapel Day. It is almost impossible to keep children clean during the day, as they are involved in activities such as painting, cooking, eating, playing outdoors, etc.

Students need to follow the guidelines for grades K through 12 listed below for fit, modesty, and design. Refer to the Preschool Handbook for specific details.

Parents are asked to dress their child according to the weather in clothing that he/she may handle somewhat independently. This practice is very helpful to the teacher during certain routines, such as restroom breaks, and fosters the child's development of self-help.

Tennis shoes or other closed-toe shoes are highly recommended for school. Sandals and flip-flops often prevent a child from fully participating in all activities.

## General Dress Policies for Boys and Girls (Kindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup>)

### Grades K-12

All clothing must fit appropriately (not excessively tight or baggy).

#### Tops

- Students may wear CCS tops, shirts, sweatshirts and hoodies purchased in previous years but are not required to. (The CCS clothing store is closed and will remain closed until further notice.)
- All tops worn must be appropriate in style, fit, and length. All shirts must have sleeves and must fit appropriately.
- All tops must be worn as purchased; no modifications to fit are allowed (for example, cutting the shirts and tying knots down the side, etc.).

#### NOT ALLOWED:

- Shirts that expose the midriff when hands are raised above the head, shirts that expose skin lower than 4 fingers below the neck, tank tops, spaghetti straps, tube tops, open back tops, halter tops, deep V-neck shirts, button up shirts with several top buttons left unbuttoned, etc. are not considered appropriate for wear on the CCS campus.
- Tops with offensive, sexual (whether implicit or explicit), or distracting designs (including skulls, skeletons, pirates, witches, alcohol, tobacco, drugs, etc.) are not allowed.
- Tops with items that are counter to the Christian culture are not allowed, including secular rock band T-shirts (for example: Kiss, Def Leppard, Rolling Stones, Black Sabbath, etc.), as well as LGBTQ themes.
- Camouflage clothing is not allowed (including jackets or coats) at any time. In addition, any clothing or accessory with a depiction of the Confederate flag is not allowed.
- We understand that there are differences in opinions when it comes to political and societal issues. However, due to their nature to cause division, no clothing or accessory of a political or societal nature will be allowed at school.

#### Pants, Skirts, Etc.

- Jeans and twill/chino type pants and shorts are allowed. Solids, plaids, stripes, and prints are allowed. Pants and shorts must be modest, neat, and appropriate in size and fit. Shorts must not be shorter than mid-thigh and should not be rolled up at the bottom or rolled down at the waist to make them shorter.
- Leggings may only be worn if they are worn underneath a skirt or dress. The skirt or dress must still meet the mid-thigh rule.
- Lower school students may wear athletic shorts or pants to school daily. Athletic shorts must meet the requirements for shorts listed above (mid-thigh length, not rolled down, etc.). Athletic-type pants include wind pants, training pants, joggers, and sweatpants. These rules apply to lower school students only (grades K-6).

#### NOT ALLOWED:

- No pajama pants, camouflage pants, or overalls are allowed.
- Pants may not be too tight in fit or worn too low as to expose undergarments when seated or bending over.
- Jeggings and other tight-fitting pants are not allowed.
- Pants that have holes, are frayed, torn, split at the seams, or cut off with ragged edges are not allowed.
- Yoga pants and leggings of any style are not appropriate.
- Athletic shorts and athletic pants (such as wind pants, training pants, joggers, and sweatpants) are NOT allowed for upper school students for 2021-22.

#### Outerwear

All outerwear must adhere to the guidelines set forth in the “Tops” section above.

#### Underwear

Undergarments (including boxers, bras, bralette straps, etc.) should not be visible.

#### Headgear

Any head covering (hats, hoods, bandanas, etc.) must be removed before entering the building. No type of hat or head covering (including school baseball hats) is acceptable at any time in the classroom or anywhere in the school building for boys or girls.

#### Jewelry, Belt Buckles, Etc.

- Body piercings are discouraged and should not be visible. Spacers are required for female students who have nose piercings.
- Girls may wear earrings. Boys may NOT wear earrings in any part of the school; earrings must be removed before entering any school building, including the gym.
- Distracting, offensive, oversized, or extreme jewelry/belt buckles/misc. is prohibited (spikes, leather collars, etc.).
- Confederate flags or symbols, etc. are not allowed.

### Hair

Students should keep their hair neat, clean, and well-groomed with no distracting hair colors or styles. Male students are allowed to have facial hair as long as it is well-groomed. They should not allow their hair length to cover their eyes and/or to extend below the bottom of the ear. Male students are not allowed to have ponytails or man buns. After one warning, students will not be allowed to return to school until the issue has been resolved.

### Body Art

Permanent or temporary tattoos are discouraged and should not be visible during the school day or on school-sponsored field trips.

### Shoes

Appropriate footwear (tennis shoes, casual shoes, loafers, nice sandals, flip flops, etc.) is required. No bedroom slippers are allowed.

Students are expected to abide by the requirements in this dress code when they are on campus, whether during the school day or for a school-sponsored event.

**See the Student Handbook (available on our website under Info > Handbooks and Forms) for information about dress code for field trips, special occasions, prom, homecoming court, school dances, and athletic dress on game days.**

## Facemasks/Face Shields

Crossroads will not require facemasks to start the 2021-2022 school year. Students are allowed to wear facemasks/face shields at all times if they elect to do so. Students must provide their own facemasks/face shields. If there are outbreaks of COVID in the CCS community, a decision regarding the parameters of a mask mandate will be made at that time.

## UPPER SCHOOL CELL PHONE & PERSONAL ELECTRONICS POLICY

Cell phones and earbuds/headphones must be turned off at 8:00 a.m. and not seen in use during the school day. Staff/teachers who see a student using a cell phone in the halls, in restrooms, during class, etc. will collect the cell phone and issue demerits per the demerit system.

**Exceptions:** Students may use their cell phones during lunch in the cafeteria **only**.

- The school's social media policy still applies--students cannot be on social networking sites during the school day.
- Violations will result in loss of privileges & demerits.



**Other electronic devices:** Personal iPads, Kindles, laptops, e-readers, etc. are not allowed on campus during the school day. Violation of this rule will be handled with the same consequences as cell phone violations.

Some colleges are not requiring a test score this year for admission consideration but check the website for any college or call their Admissions Office to make sure you know what you will need to do to apply.

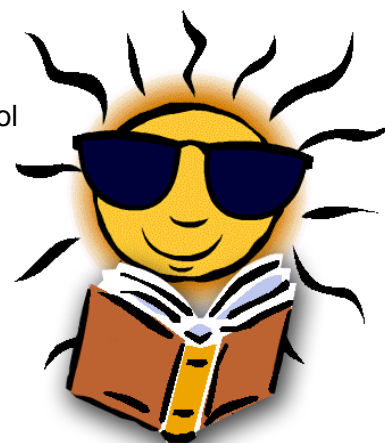
**NOTE:** The recommended cycle for taking a college entrance exam (ACT or SAT) is at least once at the end of your junior year and again at the beginning of your senior year.

## UPPER SCHOOL TABLETS & PENS

### Dell Latitude 3190 2-in-1 Tablets

CCS will provide each 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade student with a Dell tablet device (Width: 11.96" | Depth: 8.18"). Students will be able to take these devices home with them. Prior to obtaining the device, both the student and parent will sign paperwork outlining acceptable use and the costs for a damaged/lost device or accessories.

Students will be financially responsible for the devices, so we require them to store and transport their devices properly by using the provided cover specifically designed for this computer. If the cover or computer is damaged in any way, please report it to IT immediately.



### Tablet Pens

Students will be responsible for obtaining their own pens, either from the school or from another source.

We will offer a Dell tablet pen (model #PN338M) as an option for students to buy; the cost is \$40 (if sending in a check, make payable to CCS). Students can purchase a pen in the office at Open House.

After-school care will be provided for K5 through 6th grades in Room 122 from 3:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, including some holidays and other school closings. 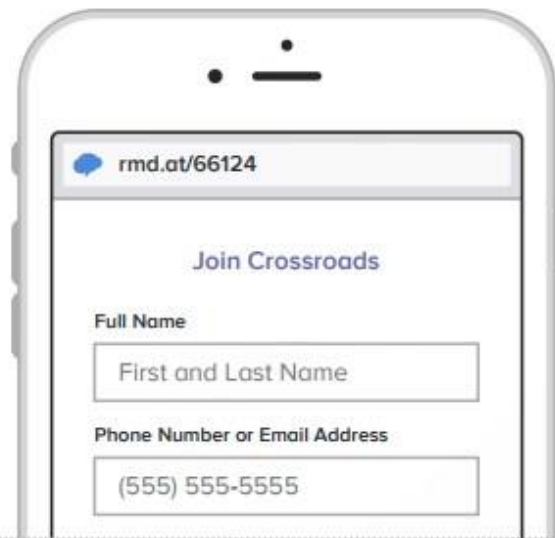

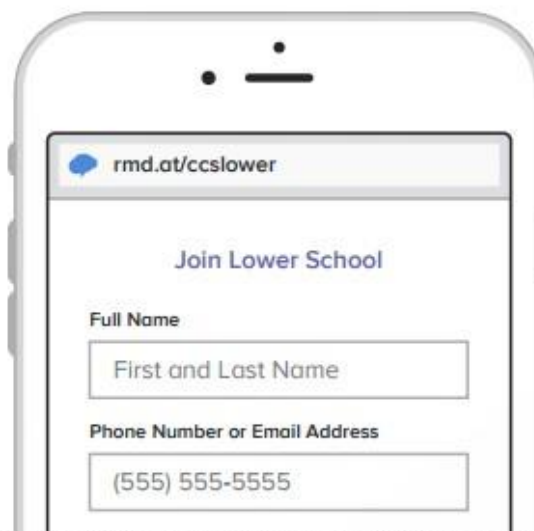

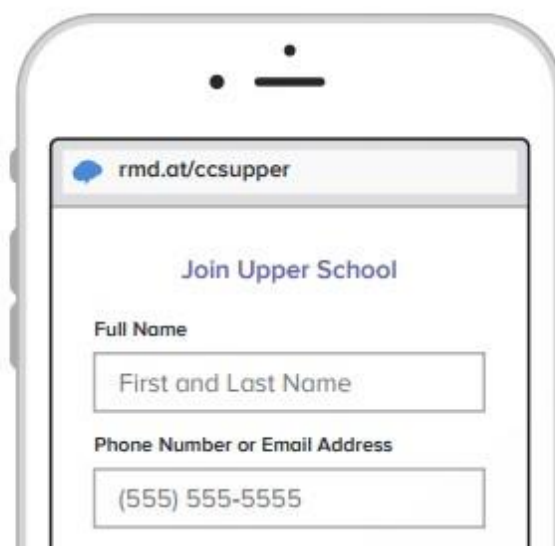

# 2021-22 Crossroads Christian School Cafeteria Information

---

Food service is an important part of your child's school day. Studies have repeatedly shown that students who eat well do better in school. Our goal is to offer every student a nutritious, delicious, and well-balanced meal.

## Plate Lunch Prices

Pre-K4 through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.....\$3.75

4<sup>th</sup> grade & up.....\$4.25

**Please see our current price list for individual pricing and other available items.  
Substitutions may be necessary due to the availability of food from vendors.**

**NOTE: All items are not offered on a daily basis.**

- *There are two options for payment:*

1. **Online Payment:** A FACTS SIS (formerly known as RenWeb) account is the preferred method. FACTS SIS allows your family to have an account to use for their lunch. This eliminates having to send cash money to school with your student.

A minimum of \$25 is needed to start an account. You are allowed to view what your student is eating with a FACTS SIS account. You also get to view your balance on line. This way you can send in money to add to the account at any time. The funds in this account are solely for the purchase food from the CCS cafeteria. The student is not allowed to take money out of the account for the vending machines, bake sales, etc.

### **\*\*\*\* Pay Online \*\*\*\***

For your convenience, you can use "PayNow" option through FACTS SIS.  
(Log in as parent, go to Family > Family Home > Family Billing.)

2. **Cash or check:** Students may bring in check or cash to the front office or cafeteria to be placed on a student's FACTS SIS lunch account.
- All daily purchases need to be made through the use of funds on a student's lunch account. For the safety of everyone, the CCS cafeteria **will NOT allow items to be purchased daily with cash**. Funds need to be placed on account through either the online payment or by sending in a check or cash (minimum \$25 to open the account).
  - To place funds on a lunch account during Open House, please stop by the front office.

## **LUNCH PROGRAM POLICY (from the CCS Student Handbook)**

### **General Information for 2021-22:**

Crossroads Christian School provides a hot lunch option on **Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday** of each week. Lunches are not included in tuition costs (with the exception of K3).

### **Parent/Visitor Lunch Policy:**

- At this time, no visitors will be allowed into the building for lunch.
- Outside food cannot be brought in for students to pick up from the front office.
