## Veterans Day – November 11

---

Veterans Day is held in honor of all those who served in the United States Armed Forces and is a federal holiday. This is different from Memorial Day, which honors those who died while serving. Many people fly a US flag on this day to show their patriotism and support for the armed services. At 11:00 a.m. a moment of silence is observed to remember those who served.

## From the College Counselor

**CFNC News:** Our College Foundation of NC representative shared that the 2021-22 Teaching Fellows Application officially opened Monday. Deadline is January 10. Students attending one of the eight partner institutions will receive up to \$4,125 per semester. For all the details and to apply, go to <https://myapps.northcarolina.edu/ncteachingfellows/>.

Remember, [www.cfnc.org](http://www.cfnc.org) has many college planning tools for you to help you apply to college, choose a major, choose a career, find money for college, etc. If you don't have an account with them, create one soon!

**FAFSA News:** If you want to make applying for financial aid as easy as possible, you may want to avoid completing the FAFSA application during a few specific times in November.

On October 26, the Department of Education announced that the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) will be unavailable on the following dates and times during November:

- Tuesday, November 2; 1:00 - 5:00 a.m. Eastern time (ET)
- Saturday, November 13; 1:00 - 5:00 a.m. ET
- Saturday, November 20; 8:00 a.m. - noon ET

Students and parents can still complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) or request the Income-Driven Repayment (IDR) Plan during the outages. However, financial information will need to be entered manually or, for the IDR Plan request, alternative documentation will need to be provided. The FAFSA application opened October 1. Apply now!

**Seniors - All the Things OneNote:** Seniors, be sure to check the Seniors - All the Things OneNote that you can access through your Microsoft Office 365 login. Information about graduation, applying to college, college fairs, transcripts, etc. can be found there!

**Sallie Mae Scholarship Search:** Sallie Mae's free [Scholarship Search](#) connects students to scholarship opportunities based on their hobbies and interests. The database now has over 6 million scholarships worth up to \$30 billion in free money for college. Plus, when students register, they can enter for a chance to win our monthly sweepstakes.<sup>1</sup>

**Golden LEAF Scholarships for 2- and 4-Year College Programs:**

Golden LEAF provides scholarships to help North Carolinians attend participating NC community colleges as well as public and private four-year colleges and universities. The Golden LEAF Scholarship Program is open to high school seniors and community college transfer students who reside in a qualifying rural, economically distressed, tobacco-dependent North Carolina county and are planning to enroll full-time in a participating public or



private college or university located in North Carolina. For more info and to see if your county is eligible, visit <https://www.goldenleaf.org/> and explore the Scholarship menu.

## A Few Lunch Reminders:

- All daily purchases need to be made through the use of funds on a student's lunch account. For the safety of everyone, **the CCS cafeteria will NOT allow items to be purchased daily with cash.** Funds need to be placed on account through either online payment or by sending in a check or cash weekly or monthly. **For online payments,** you can use "PayNow" option through FACTS SIS. (Log in as parent, go to Family > Family Home > Family Billing.)
- The office has purchased Lunchables for students who forget their lunch on Mondays and Fridays. A drink and a bag of chips are included. \$3.75 will be charged to your lunch account. If they need a lunch on Tuesdays – Thursdays, they can purchase something from the cafeteria. - No fast food can be brought in for lunch--only a lunch packed from home.



## Fall Season Wrap-Up – Go, Colts!

FIRST TIME THE FALL ATHLETIC PROGRAM HAS FINISHED WITH AN OVERALL WINNING RECORD, WITH A SCHOOL RECORD 43 TOTAL WINS!



**Volleyball Program** – First time since 2010 the Volleyball program as a whole had a winning season! Varsity won 10 games, the highest number of wins since 2010. Our JV had a great season as well, and our MS team won 9 games while battling health and injury issues throughout the season. Congratulations to **Cammy Simmons** in her first year as the Varsity coach and **Joanne Reese** in her first year as Middle School head coach!

**Soccer Program** – Varsity Boys had 15 wins--the most in our school's history (previous high was 4), 10 wins in a row,

NCISAA State Tournament Final 4, Maxpreps Rankings #3 in the state, 4 NCISAA All-State players, and lost to #1 Greenfield 2-1 in the NCISAA State Tournament Final 4 game. **Coghill** was named Coach of the Year in the MCC conference. **Ryan Adcock** ended his career with 70 goals and 78 assists and NCISAA All-State 3 years in a row.

NCISAA All-State Players: **Ryan Adcock, Will Alston, Thomas Shah,** and **Gage Edwards** who finished with 547 career saves as our goalkeeper. Our Middle School boys team lost in the MCC Conference Championship game and finished with a great season despite health and injury issues. Great job to **Holden Coghill** and **Tony Bennett** on a successful season!



**Cross Country Program** – NCISAA STATE CHAMPIONS as a team and NCISAA STATE CHAMPION INDIVIDUAL Mason Gladieux, with Trey Snide MCC Coach of the Year! Just an incredible season for not having a team in 9 years then winning a State Championship!
