

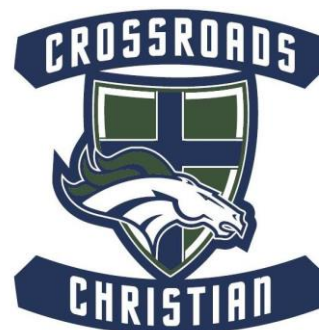

## Re-enrollment Opening January 31!

Online re-enrollment for the 2022-2023 school year will begin on **Monday, January 31**, with nearly a three-week window to re-enroll at a discounted rate. From Monday, January 31, through Saturday, February 19, families can re-enroll for only \$150 per child, a \$100 discount per child. **The enrollment fee becomes \$250 on Sunday, February 20, and enrollment opens to the public.** The online re-enrollment application will not be available until January 31, and detailed instructions will be emailed to each family at that time.

We are thankful for all our CCS families, and we look forward to continuing our partnership with you as we train our young men and women to serve Christ and to be leaders with a Christian worldview. NOTE: VISA's requirements of its vendors prohibit RenWeb (FACTS SIS) from being able to accept it in the online payment process.

## Reminder: Health Policy from Student Handbook

---

For the well-being and health consideration of all our students and staff, parents are asked to keep home any student with fevers and contagious illnesses. Students need a signed note from the parent or a doctor stating the reason for missing school. You can also email Mrs. Pegram at [bpeggram@ccscolts.org](mailto:bpeggram@ccscolts.org). Students will have five school days following an absence to provide written documentation to have that absence excused. Documentation is required of all students, even those 18 years old and older.



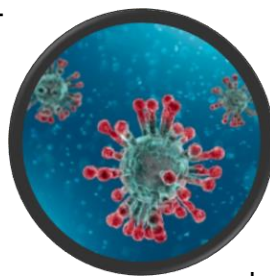
It is a policy that a student must stay home with:

- **Fever – a temperature 100°F or higher** (Students must be fever-free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.)
- **Vomiting** (Students are not allowed to return to school for 24 hours after the last vomiting incident.)
- **Flu symptoms**
- **Diarrhea** (Students are not allowed to return to school until symptoms are completely gone.)
- **Colored nasal discharge**
- **Persistent cough**
- **Strep throat** (Students are not allowed to return to school until they have been on 24 hours of antibiotics.)
- **Pinkeye** (Students are not allowed to return to school until they have been on 24 hours of antibiotic eye drops.)
- **Head lice** (all lice and eggs removed; must have physician's note)
- **Ringworm on body** (treatment for 24 hours; cover with bandage while at school)
- **Ringworm on head** (physician's note)
- **Other contagious conditions** (for example, chicken pox, impetigo, etc.)
- **Any symptoms specified by the CDC as possible Covid-19 symptoms (fever, cough, loss of taste or smell, etc.).**

## Reminder: CCS Medical Policy Related to COVID-19

---

Students should not be at school if any other family member in the home is experiencing or exhibiting any COVID-related symptoms. Parents are required to keep sick students and all siblings home for a minimum of 48 hours after a fever subsides without the use of fever-reducing medicines, as long as no other symptoms are present. A student who has a fever, along with another symptom (runny nose, headache, fatigue, sore throat, chills, cough, etc.) will be presumed positive for COVID and will be required to follow COVID positive protocols per information from Granville Vance Public Health. The only exception to a student not being placed on quarantine is a negative COVID test. With the negative test, a student can return to school, as long as he/she has been fever free for 24 hours.



As there are multiple scenarios to exposure and positive testing, please contact the office to work through your child's specific details so a plan can be established for his/her return to school. Since most protocols now allow students to return to school with a negative test after day 5 of quarantine, families who elect to have their child tested are required to test at a medical facility, as at-home test results will not be accepted.

As a reminder, upper school students on quarantine are expected to stream into classes daily and keep up with their coursework. Parents/guardians of lower school students can obtain coursework by contacting their child's teacher.
