Lunch Reminders

The cafeteria is closed on Thursdays and Fridays every week. Please either order Jersey Mike's or Chick-fil-A by each Monday or make sure you send a packed lunch with your student on those days. Outside food, including fast food, cannot be brought in for students to pick up from the front office, even on Thursdays and Fridays, per the CCS Student Handbook.

Remember, as long as students have a credit on their balance, they can order. Parents/guardians are responsible for checking their students' accounts to make sure they have a credit. **FACTS does not send out reminders when funds get low; it sends a message once the account goes below zero and freezes the account from any future charges until payment is made to the account.** This is why it is SO important for parents/guardians to monitor their FACTS accounts. Guidelines for students attending

ballgames: All lower school students must be either picked up at the end of the school day or attend aftercare—even on game days. No lower school students are allowed to be dismissed to the gym to wait for games to start. They must be picked up and driven around to the back of the building with their parent or another supervising adult, as no childcare or direct supervision is provided at games. We ask that every lower school student be supervised by an adult and never left at a game unattended. Unfortunately, we can no longer accept written permission or phone calls to dismiss lower school students directly to the gym. Due to the increase of our student population, we need to know that all students have been accounted for at the end of the school day during carpool and are turned over to adult supervision for after-school activities. Even though there is school staff in

attendance at games, many have other duties during the game or are spectators.

Upper school students need to follow the same guidelines and may not enter the gym prior to 30 minutes before the start of the game. This means that if a game begins at 4:00 p.m., they must wait and enter the gym no earlier than 3:30 p.m.

All students must remain in the gym and concession area during games. No student should be permitted back into the school hallways once they have been dismissed at the end of the day. This is simply a precaution should any type of emergency occur during game times. It is imperative that everyone is where they are supposed to be. Your help is greatly appreciated. Thank you for making sure all students are able to attend and enjoy our sports' programs safely!

Gun Safety Week in Vance & Granville counties took place the week of October 7– 11. The week is sponsored by the NC Department of Public Safety, DPI Center for Safer Schools, Granville-Vance Public Health, and District 32 Representative Frank Sossamon. On October 8, our 3rd-5th grades watched a short video featuring “Eddie Eagle” and Rep. Sossamon, and our own Captain Vaughn visited the classrooms to talk with students about gun safety. The program also offered parent meetings in both counties.

Teacher Workdays – Still Working on Accreditation!

For the first teacher workday of 2024-25 that took place during students' Fall Break, our teachers continued working on gathering information for the next accreditation process, which occurs every five years and requires about 1-1/2 to two years of preparation for the accreditation visit and evaluation. Reminder: Health Policy from Student Handbook

For the well-being and health consideration of all our students and staff, parents are asked to keep home any student with fevers and contagious illnesses. Students need a signed note from the parent or a doctor stating the reason for missing school. You can also email Mrs. Pegram at bpegam@ccscolts.org. Students will have five school days following an absence to provide written documentation to have that absence excused. Documentation is required of all students, even those 18 years old and older.

It is a policy that a student must stay home with:

- **Fever – a temperature 100°F or higher**
(Students must be fever-free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.)
- **Vomiting**
(Students are not allowed to return to school for 24 hours after the last vomiting incident.)
- **Flu symptoms**
- **Diarrhea**
(Students are not allowed to return to school until symptoms are completely gone.)
- **Colored nasal discharge**
- **Persistent cough**
- **Strep throat**
(Students are not allowed to return to school until they have been on 24 hours of antibiotics.)
- **Pinkeye**
(Students are not allowed to return to school until they have been on 24 hours of antibiotic eye drops.)
- **Head lice**
(all lice and eggs removed; must have physician's note)
- **Ringworm on body**
(treatment for 24 hours; cover with bandage while at school)
- **Ringworm on head**
(physician's note)
- **Other contagious conditions**
(for example, chicken pox, impetigo, etc.)
- **Any symptoms specified by the CDC as possible Covid-19 symptoms (fever, cough, loss of taste or smell,**



Christmas Market Vendor Registration Ends Soon!

It's time to plan for our annual Christmas Market on December 7 from 9:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. Vendors are already signing up to participate, and we are looking forward to our best event yet! Do you own a small business? Are you a crafter? We would love to help you spread the word about your business to our school and local community.

This event supports our House System, a character-building program within our student body that encourages multi-class relationships through challenges and a point system. This year we are so excited for our best Christmas Market yet! We have three years under our belts, and we are making some big changes on your behalf. Our event is growing each year, and we're looking forward to welcoming you to our family!

- Registration is open for prospective vendors.
- We offer 10' x 10' spaces for \$50 per space.
- We offer 6' x 9' spaces for those who have only one table for \$45 per space.
- This application process will help ensure we do not have a lot of product overlap:
 1. You will submit your application in Google Forms (see #7 below for link) with two photos of your booth set-up.
 2. Upon approval, you will receive an invoice with payment options, along with an option to choose an indoor or outdoor (limited availability) space and a digital copy of the flyer to share.
 3. Payment will be due within two weeks of your approval letter to avoid cancellation.

What you need to know as a vendor:

FINAL deadline is November 15.

1. The fair will be located inside the CCS cafeteria, with new outside spaces available.
2. Your spaces will be at least 6' x 9' or 10' x 10'.
3. Space prices: 6' x 9' = \$45 per space; 10' x 10' = \$50 per space. After September 30, spaces will increase by \$10 for each size.
4. You are responsible for bringing all display materials, including tables, extension cords, display boards, etc.
5. On November 1, you will be able to sign up for time slots to set up your space on Friday, December 6 from 5:00-7:00 p.m. or Saturday, December 7, at 7:00 a.m.
6. Students will be available to help you unload and load up at the end of the set-up day and craft fair day.
7. Click to apply: <https://forms.gle/9jsRmoMuiW3nRzxs5> (this will open a Google Form). ONLY APPLY THROUGH THIS FORM. Scammers have sometimes put comments in our Facebook event that instruct potential vendors to send them money.
8. Upon application approval, you will receive an invoice with payment options & instructions, an option to choose from a limited number of outdoor spaces or an indoor space, and a digital copy of the flyer to share. Registration is complete after payment has been received.
