### Note about math choices:

Minimum college entrance requirements for the 17 UNC-system universities (NCSU, ASU, UNC-CH, ECU, etc.):

**Algebra I and II, Geometry, and one unit beyond Algebra II,**

**Algebra I and II, and two units beyond Algebra II, or**

**Integrated Math I, II, and III, and one unit beyond Integrated Math III.**

**\*Personal Finance and Accounting do not meet the UNC-system minimum admissions requirements.**
