## COMMUNITY

Crossroads provides the opportunity for a Christian education to the residents of Henderson and surrounding areas in Vance County, NC (2022 population: 42,138). Vance County is made up of 51.6% African-American, 44.5% Caucasian, 9% Hispanic or Latino, 1.0 % Asian, and the remainder other populations. While 84.4% of the population has a high school degree or higher, only 17.1% of the county's population over the age of 25 has a bachelor's degree or higher in education. The median household income (2017-2021) of Vance County residents is \$45,243. Our student body is primarily Caucasian, with a small percentage of minorities. Students come from nearby towns north & south of our school and across the Virginia line. Vance Co. public schools' graduation rates are at 85%; in the past 15 years, Crossroads has had a 100% graduation rate.

## SCHOOL

Crossroads Christian School opened in 2005 and is a comprehensive private school enrolling 532 students in grades K3-12, with an average class size of 20 in the lower school and 16 in the upper school (multiple sections of grade levels). The faculty/staff consists of 60 members who also serve as advisers, tutors, coaches, committee chairs, and club sponsors. Thirteen percent of our student population receives tuition assistance.

## GRADE POINT CALCULATION (GPA)

GPA is computed on a 4-point scale. Beginning with grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Honors classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in May. Dual enrollment classes taken off campus at other colleges are not included on the transcript or GPA calculations. Transcripts show a weighted and unweighted GPA, although the weighted GPA is now used as our official GPA for all CCS-related awards and honors, including valedictorian and salutatorian honors.

## CURRICULUM

The traditional 10-month school year is divided into four quarters, nine weeks each. A normal Lower School (grades K-4th) schedule consists of eight subjects, in addition to specials such as computer, music, art, and PE. A normal Upper School (grades 5th-12th) schedule consists of seven subjects, including electives. Each core subject earns one credit for the entire school year.

### **Diploma Requirements**

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Math
- 4 units of History (including U.S. History)
- 4 units of Bible
- 4 units of Science (1 including a lab)
- 2 units of Foreign Language
- 1 unit of Physical Education
- 2 elective units per year at CCS  
(0.5 credit each; study hall = 0 credit)

Students who transfer in are not penalized for missing electives or required classes not offered at their previous schools.

## EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

### **Honor Roll & National Honor Society/National Beta Club**

A and A/B Honor Rolls are determined after each quarter. Students in the 10th, 11th, & 12th grades may be invited to become members of the CCS chapter of the National Honor Society if they have earned a 3.5 GPA for the 1st semester of the school year. Ninth graders may be inducted as members of the Senior National Beta Club with standing on the A/B honor roll.

### **Arts**

Students in the Upper School can choose to take part in Art I, II, III, or IV as electives. Art students may take part in an annual Art Extravaganza in May. Students with musical talents take part in our Praise Band, leading our worship in bi-weekly chapels through vocal and instrumental music, and a Chorus group competes in a regional event each spring.

### **Athletics**

CCS offers varsity, junior varsity, and middle school teams in soccer, basketball, volleyball, softball, and baseball, as well as cheer squads, cross-country running, and a varsity golf team. These teams compete with local public and private schools. Our teams are members of the Mid-Carolina Conference in the NCISAA which includes the Burlington, Clayton, Durham, Raleigh, Sanford, and Henderson, N.C. areas.

### **Student Council (aka House Council)**

Students in grades 8-12 are elected to Student Council to foster school spirit and lead classes in community service projects.
